# 5. Delegation- attended meeting via zoom at 7:28pm

Resident told council that he plans on building a retirement home on the property. Residents believe that there may have been a mix-up with the property address because of the location. Resident told council that he came to the office in October to have the permit for water and sewer, he was told due to the time of year town would not be able to do a water and sewer installation at that time, but will go and have look at the area to advise resident if water and sewer could be completed in the spring. then told council that after having conversation with and the matter being addressed to council that he was then told that he could have town water but as for the sewer he would need to put in his own septic field as he couldn't get town sewer.

asked if we could revisit in the spring of the year, that we would have maintenance look into the matter again and to see what solution can be done about this sewer issue. said that would be great and was told that the office will be in contact with him as soon as we have any answers.

## attended meeting by Zoom at 7:49pm

Advised the group members attending the meeting that the Pynn's Pond Hall is now open, the electric issue is now fixed. Mayor Parsons read to the groups the expectations for the groups to follow. 1. NO SMOKING - Smoking and tobacco products are not allowed in or around the facility. 2. Building capacity must not be exceeded at any time. 3. No tape or tacks are to be used on the walls or doors. Use the provided board. 4. At the end of each use you are expected to sweep and mop the floor if needed, put equipment and chairs away, take out trash and recycling, close and lock all windows and doors (storm windows too), turn off lights and make sure bathrooms are clean and tidy. 5. During any public assembly (meetings, plays, concerts, dances) all exit signs must be lit and never obstructed by scenery, props, etc.6. Seating should provide ample clear aisles for easy and safe access to exits.7. All committees must store their own stuff in their own closet/lockers. You will be given a closet or locker, not both. No locker should be stored in the kitchen. 8. You are responsible for the building during your use. Any non-scheduled individuals or groups should be refused entry while you are using the building. 9. Fridges are there to be used by all committees! No storing food in the fridge

overnight, please take food with you or keep stored in your own cabinets. 10. Only the committee chair is responsible for the keys. Keys should not be given out to other members. 11. Report any damaged or broken equipment to town clerk.

from 4-H Group asked about having their closet and a cabinet, because that is what they had before cause the closet they have is very small. Council had talked about maybe sharing the rec closet and maybe turning it into two closets inside of one big closet. Clerk Bennett also told the groups that they can store their items that they don't always use in the basement of the main hall if they wish.

Groups were told that drinks and other items can not be stored in the cooler over night, when it is not their time for the use of the hall, that all items must be removed, stored in the closets or taken home.

Member from the galley said that this was disrespectful to seniors, and it was explained to member that it was no right from one group to store items in the cooler and other groups are not able to use the cooler when it is there time for the Hall.

Groups were told that if they didn't respect the hall and use the hall according to the expectations, then groups will lose the use of the hall.

r had asked if the seniors' groups were allowed to have birthday parties for members that were celebrating their 70 and 80 birthdays and if they are allowed to invite the families of this person. Council told the member that they are to check with the office to see if it was available and they could not go over the amount the hall could seat. The head people of the groups signed the exception sheet and passed them to Assistant Clerk Bursey.

So, he feels that someone else should do Brake Heights. also said that a site visit should have been down before the contact was signed.
